NC SHAG TAG LICENSE PLATES FOR SHAGGERS

The Great State of North Carolina has made it official: The Shag is North Carolina's "Most Popular Dance" and to show everybody how proud you are to be a Shagger, you can now display your North Carolina D.M.V. "SHAG TAG". Your License plate logo tells everyone that "I'd Rather Be Shaggin". The Tags are only \$15.00 for a numbered tag and if you want it Personalized, it will be \$45.00 extra. You get 4 spaces to be creative and say what you want to say on the personalized tag. Remember

that \$5.00 of your license plate fee will be donated to the Hall Of Fame Foundation to help Shaggers in need. You can order your plate thru DMV now so you can tell everybody that "I'd Rather Be Shaggin". Copy and paste this website address in your browser to order your plate directly from NCDMV.
